# Keynote presenter Maurice Webb

aurice Webb is a former foster youth who aged out of care in 2003 and faced misfortune throughout his life. He has experienced homelessness, starvation, loneliness, poverty, and depression and even jail as a delinquent. Maurice has been in three foster homes and one foster care placement. He aged out and was once again homeless after funding stopped for him. He fought hard and made it to college. He then combined his childhood experience with his education and professional expertise to work on behalf of other children in the foster care system. He has been the recipient of many awards, including the William Tilton award, receiving thousands of dollars for college.

Today, Maurice works with the Annie E. Casey Foundation as a Technical Assistant. He travels throughout

the United States, assisting child welfare agencies that have the foresight to engage foster children in the process of improving the foster care system. His responsibility is to raise awareness of the needs of foster children and to promote systemic changes that improve the delivery of services to children in out-of-home care, such as securing for them college scholarships. Maurice is happily married to LyAshia Webb. He is now a college graduate, ordained minister, entrepreneur and consultant. "My life has come full circle."

# Adult Navigating Funding Sources for Youth Aging Out of Foster Care

### Adult Reconnect: Relationships and Permanency for Teens in Foster Care

Lake Huron Room This workshop will assist participants in understanding the importance of family and other relationships in a youth's past—healing and managing those relationships to promote permanence. As a result of this workshop, attendees will be able to understand how the foster care process robs youth of critical relationships and personal history; understand the impact of complex trauma on foster care youth and why specialized treatment is necessary; list strategies to assist youth in reclaiming their pasts and reconnecting with others including birth family members; list ways in which social workers and therapists can empower youth in decisions about their lives; and employ at least one strategy in daily practice that may lead to a permanent family for a youth.

Presenter: **Toyna Goodno** has been case manager for the Reconnect: It's Up to Me program at Bethany Christian Services for two and a half years. Prior to her post at Reconnect, she was a foster care case manager (1996-1999) and coordinator and advocate for the Family Group Decision Making program (1999-2006). Toyna graduated from CMU in 1996 and has worked for both Catholic Charities West Michigan (formerly Catholic Social Services) and Bethany Christian Services.

# Youth Teen Voice: Dating Violence/Sexual Assault
